



**MINUTES  
PUBLIC BUDGET HEARING  
WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 14, 2020 6:00 PM  
Carencro City Hall  
Carencro, Louisiana**

Mayor Glenn L. Brasseaux called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Council member Kim Guidry led the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge Mayor Brasseaux asked for a moment of silence for our military service personnel, along with our veterans and their families who have served and for those who continue to serve our country defending our freedoms.

Mayor Brasseaux then turned over the meeting to City Manager Don Chauvin and City Clerk Gwen Martin to review the city's budget with the council.

City Manager Don Chauvin and City Clerk Gwen Martin reviewed the 2019/2020 amended budget and the 2020/2021 proposed budget for the City of Carencro.

Parc Commissioner Tom Meyers and Parc Director Frank Wittenberg reviewed the 2019/2020 amended budget and the 2020/2021 proposed budget for Park and Recreation Commission, Inc.

The proposed budget for the city and Parc will be up for final adoption at the November 16, 2020 council meeting.

Mayor Brasseaux asked for a motion to amend the agenda to discuss Hurricane Delta debris information only.

Councilmember Sinegal made a motion to amend the agenda to discuss Hurricane Delta debris information; seconded by Councilmember Arceneaux; motion approved.

Mayor Brasseaux and City Manager Don Chauvin presented information to the council and public in reference to Hurricane Delta debris. City Manager Don Chauvin stated that he contacted Paul Holmes with Lamats to follow FEMA guidelines for a debris contract and a notice of award from the City of Carencro. Once the contract is signed the vendor will haul the debris to Post Road for burning once the burn pit is installed.

Mayor Brasseaux informed the council and public that the generators worked throughout the city with no interruptions. Pelican Waste is behind schedule due to Hurricane Delta

and is working diligently to service our citizens. Citizens will be notified of procedures to follow for debris pick up.

Mayor Brasseaux sent out a special thank you to all departments, police, fire, utility workers and City Manager Don Chauvin in preparedness and aftermath of Hurricane Delta.

Councilmember Babineaux made a motion to adjourn; seconded by Councilmember Capritto; motion approved.

With no further comments, the meeting adjourned at 7:45 p.m.
